If he has no particular desire to wear the martyr's garment—tar and feather—he had better [stop] for you will be dealt with roughly, if you don't attend to your proper calling, more closely."

The Requisition in Southern Illinois. The Golconda Ilerald of the 13th inst., continues its war on the Rev. James M. West in the following strain:

That he is a circulator of abolition documents he dare not deny; that while he officiates as a colporteur for the "American Reform Tract and Book Secrety," he cannot be a law-abiding citizen, nor a good Christian; that where such documents as he circulates, are read and believed, there cannot exist any attachment to the union of these States, nor respect for the general laws of the land. Politically we are his enemy, and shall use all honorable means in our power to subvert his influence, for we know, if his opinious predominate.
